Veteran Justice Outreach (VJO) Program

The purpose of the Veterans Justice Outreach (VJO) Program is to avoid the unnecessary criminalization of mental illness and extended incarceration among Veterans by ensuring that eligible justice-involved Veterans have timely access to VHA services as clinically indicated. Veterans Justice Outreach Specialists are responsible for direct outreach, assessment, and case management for justice-involved Veterans in local courts and jails, and liaison with local justice system partners. 

Transitional Housing Programs

-Grant and Per Diem (GPD)-

Depending upon what your individual needs and on bed availability at particular locations, you may be eligible for one of the Grant and Per Diem (GPD) Programs. The GPD programs are transitional, supportive housing in which homeless Veterans may potentially stay for up to two years with the goal of working toward permanent housing during this period. GPD Programs involve a range of structured activities, such as group and house meeting attendance and participation, opportunities to meet with non-VA human service providers, and offerings for volunteer, social, and civic opportunities. Veterans are allowed 3 admissions to a GPD program in their lifetime. There are circumstances where this limit may be waived. The determination is made between the GPD program site staff, the VA liaison assigned to the GPD program site, and the national GPD program headquarters.

Veterans with an honorable or other than honorable discharge may be eligible for the GPD program. The Veteran's period of service must include a period of active military duty not for the purpose of training. Therefore, you may be eligible for VA homeless out-reach services while you are in the GPD program even when you may not be eligible for VA health care. Veterans are provided lodging at the GPD sites and case management. The VA pays for services and case management. Veterans may pay a residential fee.

As a general rule, in order to be admitted to any one of the GPD Programs, Veterans need to have a 30-day sobriety from illicit substances and alcohol; GPD Programs have a zero tolerance policy for illicit substance and alcohol consumption and/or possession. Veterans are required to have had a physical and mental health evaluation 30-day prior to entering a GPD Program. You will be asked to complete Releases of Information and/or fill out applications for GPD Programs of interest. VA Homeless Outreach team members can assist with the completion of applications for GPD Programs.

Some individual GPD Programs encourage or require face-to-face interviews and/or tours of the facility prior to admission. VA Homeless Outreach team members are only able to accommodate one visit per Veteran to a GPD Program, if you are interested in visiting more than one prior to committing. You should consider coordinating transportation arrangements independently for additional visits.

Each site develops their own specific criteria for admission due to the different offerings provided at each program. Some sites have limited space available for families and/or couples on a case-by-case basis.

Homeless Veterans who wish to be considered for admission to the Harbor Homes' single-room occupancy residence must be over the age of 62 or disabled.

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VA Supported Housing Program (VASH)

Homeless Veterans may qualify for the VASH program. VASH provides Veterans with long-term, ongoing case management in the community and a Section 8 Housing Choice voucher. Veterans must demonstrate a willingness to engage in goal-oriented activities, meet routinely with a case manager, comply with lease and occupancy agreements, and live within an hour of either the VA Medical Center or a Community-Based Outreach Clinic (CBOC). Notify a VA Homeless Outreach Worker if you are interested in learning more about the eligibility criteria, policies, and procedures associated with being a VASH enrollee and wish to be considered for VASH by the White River Junction VA homeless team.

Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF)

Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) assists homeless and at-risk Veteran families. Through the SSVF Program, VA aims to improve very low-income Veteran families' housing stability. Grantees (private non-profit organizations and consumer cooperatives) will provide eligible Veteran families with outreach, case management, and assistance in obtaining VA and other benefits, which may include:

Health care services	Legal services	Daily living services	Child care services
Fiduciary and payee services	Transportation services	Personal financial planning services	Housing counseling services

In addition, grantees may also provide time-limited payments to third parties (e.g., landlords, utility companies, moving companies, and licensed child care providers) if these payments help Veterans' families stay in or acquire permanent housing on a sustainable basis.

VA Health Care Eligibility and Enrollment for Veterans

Eligibility for VA health care is dependent upon a number of variables, which may influence the final determination of the services for which you qualify. These factors include the nature of a veteran's discharge from military service (e.g., honorable, other than honorable, dishonorable), length of service, VA adjudicated disabilities (commonly referred to as service-connected disabilities), income level, and available VA resources among others. Reservists and National Guardsmen must have served active duty by a federal activation, and for reasons other than for training purposes. **The character of discharge you received from the military can be a factor. It is not an issue if you received:**

An honorable discharge	A general discharge, or	A discharge under honorable conditions
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If you have a different character of discharge, you may still be eligible for care. Contact your Enrollment Coordinator at your local VA health care facility to see if you qualify. The length of your service may also matter. It depends on when you served. There's no length of service requirement for:

Former enlisted persons who started active duty before September 8, 1980, or	Former officers who first entered active duty before October 17, 1981
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All other veterans must have 24 months of continuous active duty military service for reasons other than for training, or meet one of the exceptions described below.

You do not have to meet the 24 continuous months of active duty service requirement if you:

Were a reservist who was called to Active Duty by federal executive order, and who completed the term for which you were called, and who was granted an other than dishonorable discharge, or	Were a National Guard member who was called to Active Duty by federal executive order, and who completed the term for which you were called, and who was granted an other than dishonorable discharge, or
Are only requesting a benefit for or in connection with: a service-connected condition or disability; or treatment and/or counseling of sexual trauma that occurred while on active military service; or treatment of conditions related to ionizing radiation; or head or neck cancer related to nose or throat radium treatment while in the military.	Were discharged for a reason other than disability, but you had a medical condition at the time that was disabling, and in the opinion of a doctor, would have justified a discharge for disability (in this last case, the disability must be documented in service records).
Were discharged or released from active duty for a hardship* , or	Were discharged with an "early out"*; or
Have been determined by VA to have compensable service-connected conditions; or	Were discharged or released from active duty for a disability that began in the service or got worse because of the service*; or
* must be documented on DD214
